Minister's Introduction

This report provides statistical information about how the *Right to Information Act 2009* and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* operated across government agencies during the financial year 2013–14.

These two Acts provide individuals with a right to access government held information, and a right to amend personal information about themselves that is held by government, subject to some qualifications. These Acts are an important platform for ensuring accountability and transparency, and to enhance the integrity of government. I place high priority on these values, and this report to the Queensland Parliament, covering the 2013–2014 financial year, provides information about how these priorities are being actioned every day by agencies within the Queensland Government.

A number of machinery-of-Government changes occurred throughout the year, and these have led to some increases in applications for some agencies.

This year, the community awareness campaign run during Privacy Awareness Week 2014 encouraged people to take an active and informed approach to protecting their personal information. In addition, a parallel awareness campaign within the public sector raised awareness and understanding of the responsibilities of public servants under the *Information Privacy Act 2009* when handling personal information on behalf of government agencies.

For the 2013–14 reporting year, all figures have been reported based on the actual applications processed by individual RTI and Privacy units.

I am pleased to table this report.

Overview

This annual report covers the 2013-14 financial year regarding the operation of the *Right to Information Act 2009* (RTI Act) and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* (IP Act).

The primary object of the RTI Act is to give a right of access to information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest to give the access.

The IP Act works in parallel with the RTI Act and provides for the fair collection and handling of personal information by Queensland Government agencies; and a right of access to, and amendment of, personal information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest.

The IP Act sets out 11 Information Privacy Principles (IPPs) with which all agencies must adhere, except for Queensland Health, which is subject to the National Privacy Principles (NPPs). The IPPs and NPPs govern how Queensland Government agencies collect, store, use and disclose personal information.

Releasing government information

The process of routinely releasing government information to the public is commonly referred to as the "push" model. Under this model, information is released administratively via mechanisms which include agencies' publication schemes and disclosure logs. As a result, access applications for information under the legislation are provided as a mechanism of last resort.

Publication Scheme

A publication scheme is a structured list of an agency's information that is readily available to the public, free of charge wherever possible. Every government agency which is subject to the RTI Act must have a publication scheme.

Disclosure Log

Disclosure logs form part of the "push" model where information released under a RTI application is made available for access to a wider public audience by being published on agency websites. They provide speedy access to information already released under the RTI application process. They can provide a cost and time benefit to both the individual and agency by reducing the number of additional applications under the RTI Act for the same information.

Furthering the objects of the Acts

In the reporting period, agencies, Ministers and statutory authorities made efforts to further the objects of the RTI Act and the IP Act. This information is summarised in Appendix 23.

Reporting requirements

Legislative basis

Section 185 of the RTI Act and section 194 of the IP Act require statistical and other information to be collected from Ministers and agencies. The following outlines each requirement:

- **Section 185(1) RTI Act** and **section 194(1) IP Act** requires the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice to prepare the report and table it in Parliament.
- **Section 185(2) RTI Act** and **section 194(2) IP Act** refers to the Right to Information Regulation 2009 (the RTI Regulation) and the Information Privacy Regulation 2009 (the IP Regulation) which set out the details of the information required to be included in the report (*refer to Appendix 1*).
- **Section 194(3) IP Act** - An annual report under this section may be included as part of an annual report the Minister is required to give under the RTI Act.

In this report, the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice has reported statistics on both the RTI Act and IP Act for the period 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014.

Data from all Ministers and agencies covered by the RTI and IP Acts were collected and collated by the Right to Information and Privacy Unit, Department of Justice and Attorney-General (DJAG) for inclusion in this report.

Details of the matters prescribed under section 8 of the RTI Regulation and section 6 of the IP Regulation for the 2013-14 financial year are set out in appendices 2 – 22 and provide a report on each government portfolio.

Explanation of terms used in this report

Term	Explanation
Access application	An application for information made under either the RTI Act or Chapter 3 of the IP Act.
Access charge	Charges prescribed under a regulation and payable for being given access to documents. In the reporting period, for example, black and white photocopying charges were 20 cents for each A4 page.
Amendment application	An application made under the IP Act to have personal information amended on the basis that it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading.
Application fee	The fee prescribed in the RTI Regulation and payable for an access application under the RTI Act. In the reporting period, the application fee was \$41.90.
Internal Review	A review of a decision within an agency by a person who is no less senior than the original decision maker.
External Review	A review by the Information Commissioner of a decision made by an agency or Minister.
Processing charge	Charges prescribed in the RTI Regulation for searching for, or retrieving a document, and making, or doing things related to making, a decision on an application. In general, processing charges are payable for RTI Act applications where an agency or Minister spends more than five hours processing an application. In the reporting period, the processing fees were \$6.25 for each 15 minutes or part thereof.
Portfolio/agencies	Agencies within a Minister's administrative responsibility are reported on under the relevant portfolio heading, e.g. the Justice and Attorney-General portfolio includes DJAG and the Office of the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, as well as agencies such as Legal Services Commission and QLeave.

Summary of data

The detailed data obtained from Ministers and agencies is set out in appendices 2 – 22 of this report and includes information required under:

- subsections 8(1)(a) to (g), 8(1)(j) and 8(2) of the RTI Regulation; and
- subsections 6(a) to (g) and 6(j) of the IP Regulation.

Disciplinary action

In relation to subsection 8(1)(h) of the RTI Regulation and subsection 6(h) of the IP Regulation, Ministers and agencies have advised that there has been no disciplinary action instigated against an officer arising from the administration of the Acts.

Proceedings brought for offences

Ministers and agencies have advised no proceedings were brought for offences against section 175(1) or (3) of the RTI Act or section 184(1) or (3) of the IP Act (subsection 8(1)(i) of the RTI Regulation and subsection 6(i) of the IP Regulation).

Efforts by agencies, Ministers and statutory authorities to further the object of the RTI Act and IP Act

Appendix 23 summarises the efforts made by agencies, Ministers and statutory authorities during the 2013-14 financial year which build on efforts made in the previous year. Efforts to further the objects of the legislation are required under section 8(1)(k) of the RTI Regulation and section 6(k) of the IP Regulation.

In the reporting period, agencies made efforts to:

- provide officers with RTI and IP awareness training for cross-skilling of RTI decision makers;
- provide IP awareness training to individuals and business units, including new officers at corporate induction sessions, e.g. RTI included in Code of Conduct training sessions;
- use redaction technology in the processing of all RTI and IP access applications in order to make processing more efficient and productive;
- implement, upgrade and support administrative access schemes to facilitate proactive and timely disclosure of information, e.g. RTI business process review to streamline application processes and engage with applicants early in the process; and
- engage their RTI and IP practitioners in regular RTI and IP Managers' forums which assist to build strong networks across Queensland's state and local government agencies and statutory authorities.

Machinery of government changes

Following legislative changes, from 29 October 2013 Q-COMP (Workers' Compensation Regulatory Authority) became part of the Office of Fair and Safe Work Queensland.

On 1 November 2013, Machinery of Government changes resulted in Queensland Corrective Services (QCS) transferring from the former Department of Community Safety to the Department of Justice and Attorney-General. The Department of Community Safety was created in March 2009 and included the Queensland Ambulance Service, Queensland Fire and Rescue Services, QCS and Emergency Management Queensland.

Additionally, the Prostitution Licensing Authority and Parole Board transitioned to the Department of Justice and Attorney-General, and on 1 October 2013 the Queensland Ambulance Service transferred to Queensland Health.

On 1 November 2013, the Public Safety Business Agency (PSBA) was established. PSBA provides corporate and business services to Queensland police, fire and emergency service agencies. PSBA provides a range of services including finance, human resources, information and communication technology, ministerial and executive services, media and business strategy to its partner agencies – QPS, Queensland Fire and Emergency Services and the Office of the Inspector-General Emergency Management. PSBA also provides information communications technology support to the Queensland Ambulance Service and QCS.

As a result of the changes, PSBA process right to information applications for QPS; Queensland Fire and Emergency Services; the Inspector-General, Emergency Management and its own operational areas (including Blue Card Services, State Government Security and the Queensland Government Air Wing).

For the 2013-14 reporting year, all figures have been reported based on the actual applications processed by individual RTI and Privacy units.

Non-compliant access applications

If an application fails to comply with the requirements under the legislation, even after consultation with the applicant, a Prior Written Notice (PWN) of the decision is sent under *section 33 – Noncompliance with application requirement*

(5) If, after giving the opportunity mentioned in subsection (3)¹ and any consultation, an agency or Minister decides the application does not comply with all relevant application requirements, the agency or Minister must, within 10 business days after making the decision, give the applicant prescribed written notice of the decision.

This allows the applicant review rights.

Under the current 'Reporting guidelines – RTI and IP annual report for 2013-14' agencies are not required to include 'non-compliant' applications in their statistics. However, some agencies have been including these applications in previous reporting years. Therefore, it should be noted that some agency figures are lower for the 2013-14 reporting period due to this anomaly.

Overview and comparison

Detailed information for each agency is presented in the appendices and summarised in the tables and figures below.

Table 1 presents summary information about 2013-14 activity by agency. It shows:

- the total number of RTI/IP access and amendment applications received decreased slightly from the previous year – from 13,381 to 12,358.
- the total number of pages considered was 1,911,152, representing a 3.7 per cent increase from 1,839,947 in 2012-13.
- the total number of pages released in full or part equated to 71 per cent in 2013-14, compared to the 2012-13 result of 74.7 per cent.
- a slight decrease in internal reviews from the previous year's total of 294 compared to 290 for 2013-14.

¹ Section 33(3) requires an agency or Minister to give an applicant a reasonable opportunity to make an application compliant prior to refusing to deal with it on the grounds that it does not comply.

- a decrease in external reviews from the previous year's total of 429 compared to 395 for 2013-14.
- a 17.6 per cent decrease in fees received, with a total of \$614,691.83 being received in 2012-13 compared to \$522,638.55 in 2013-14.

Figure 1 indicates the total number of RTI/IP access and amendment applications received by agencies and Ministers decreased slightly between 2012-13 (13,381) and 2013-14 (12,358). These figures include both applications for information (access applications) and applications to have personal information amended on the basis it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading (amendment applications).

Figure 1. Number of RTI/IP access and amendment applications received, 2000-01 to 2013-14



Figure 2. Access applications, 1992-93 to 2013-14



Figure 3. Number of IP amendment applications received, 1992–93 to 2013–14



Notes about Appendices 2 to 22

Deletion where no data returned

Where an agency has submitted a 'nil return' the line has been deleted from the table.

Disclosure logs section 8(1)(d) RTI Regulation

Not all documents considered will be published on a disclosure log.

Section 78 of the RTI Act applies if a person makes a valid access application to a department or a Minister. Section 78A applies if a person makes a valid access application to another agency, e.g. statutory authority.

Section 78B(1) states –

An agency maintaining a disclosure log must ensure the disclosure log complies with any guidelines published by the Minister on the Minister's website (to the extent the guidelines are consistent with this Act).

Section 78B(2) states –

Without limiting subsection (1), an agency must delete from any document or information included in a disclosure log under section 78 or 78A, any information (including an individual's name) –

- (a) the publication of which is prevented by law; or*
- (b) that may be defamatory; or*
- (c) that, if included in the disclosure log, would unreasonably invade an individual's privacy; or*
- (d) that is, or allows to be ascertained, information –*
 - (i) of a confidential nature that was communicated in confidence by a person other than the agency; or*
 - (ii) that is protected from disclosure under a contract; or*
- (e) that, if included in the disclosure log, would cause substantial harm to an entity.*

Access to some documents may have been provided in 2012-13, with documents being considered for publication or published to a disclosure log in 2013-14. In those cases, publication in 2013-14 will be reported in that year's annual report.

Recording refusal of access – section 8(1)(c) RTI Regulation and section 6(c) IP Regulation

Section 47(3)(a) of the RTI Act provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises exempt information under section 48. Section 48(4) of the RTI Act (exempt information) defines exempt information as information that is exempt information under Schedule 3. Refusals of access to exempt information may therefore be recorded as either refusals under section 48 or Schedule 3.

Section 47(3)(b) provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises information the disclosure of which will be contrary to the public interest under section 49. Schedule 4 then sets out the factors for deciding the public interest. Refusals of access to 'contrary to the public interest' information may therefore be recorded as either refusals under section 49 or Schedule 4.

APPENDIX 1 – Regulations

Right to Information Regulation 2009

Section 8 Report to Assembly on Act's operation – Act, section 185

- (1) For section 185(2) of the Act, details of the following matters must be included in a report under section 185(1) of the Act in relation to the financial year to which the report relates:
 - (a) the number of access applications received by each agency or Minister;
 - (b) for each agency or Minister –
 - (i) the number of refusals to deal with an access application under section 40 of the Act; and
 - (ii) the number of refusals to deal with an access application under section 41 of the Act; and
 - (iii) the number of refusals to deal with an access application under section 43 of the Act;
 - (c) for each agency or Minister – the number of refusals of access under each paragraph of section 47(3) of the Act and any other particular provision of the Act relevant to the refusal;
 - (d) for each agency or Minister – the number of documents included in a disclosure log under section 78 of the Act;
 - (e) for each agency or Minister –
 - (i) the number of deemed decisions under section 46 of the Act; and
 - (ii) the number of decisions on internal review taken to have been made under section 83(2) of the Act;
 - (f) for each agency or Minister –
 - (i) the number of internal review applications received; and
 - (ii) for each application, whether the decision on the internal review was different from the decision subject to internal review, and how it was different;
 - (g) for each agency or Minister –
 - (i) the number of external review applications made in relation to a decision of the agency or Minister; and
 - (ii) the number of external review applications where there was no preceding internal review application to the agency or Minister; and
 - (iii) the number of decisions on external review that affirmed the decision of the agency or Minister; and
 - (iv) the number of decisions on external review that varied the decision of the agency or Minister; and
